Adam came to State College after he was sexually assaulted in a shelter in another city. The wounds of selfharm on his arms reflected the state of his soul. Wary of sleeping in yet another shelter, his vulnerability was palpable. The volunteer staff welcomed him warmly, promised him there was always someone awake through the night, and did everything possible to reassure him he was safe at Out of the Cold. Adam has a heart for others in the same situation and has become an outspoken advocate for the unsheltered. He stressed how humiliating it is to have to lug your belongings with you everywhere you go, as if to shout "hey, homeless guy coming through." It's warm months now, but that doesn't mean that the staff and volunteers who will look to supply people with safe housing during the winter months in our community are at rest.
