Grocery Gift Cards for Elementary Families

In a year of financial unpredictability from world events, natural disasters, and frightening inflation stories, it's a good time to begin thinking about what the Christmas season will be like for those who find it difficult to meet regular needs. For many years, through the generosity of our congregation, we have provided toys, books, clothing, and household items to families within our community by pulling angels from a tree in our lobby.

However, in the last few years, we have recognized a need to provide food for families when the schools are on break during the Christmas holiday. Seeing this need, we have partnered with 2 Elementary Schools to provide grocery gift cards. These gift cards are purchased with money we receive for this mission. The cards are then shared with those identified within the schools who may struggle to provide a holiday meal or food during this time when school is not in session. Last year, we were able to provide 52 Grocery Gift Cards to families within these two elementary schools. We will again be partnering with these schools to provide grocery gift cards and will be collecting money through December. Please visit our display in the lobby area for our donation box. Tithing Envelopes

January will soon be here. For some of you, that means picking up your offering envelopes for 2026. You may notice a change ... due to changes in membership from death, moves, and use of online giving, significant gaps have formed in the numbers assigned to individuals who receive envelopes. Because of the way offering envelopes must be ordered (i.e. numbers must be consecutive), we have been ordering many more boxes than we actually use. As a means of ensuring responsible use of funds, the Finance Committee has decided to reassign numbers on the envelopes. This will mean we will be able to cut our envelope order in half (thus saving us half the current cost). So, if you notice your envelopes have a new number, this is the reason. We are attempting to ensure responsible use of the resources God has blessed us with, so that we ensure vital ministry of disciple-making is possible.

Emergency Shelter Team

Mt. Nittany UMC is one of 5 shelters here in the Centre County Region. We have been asked to ensure we have a team of people ready to activate our building for emergency shelter if needed. The Red Cross would like to do some training with our Emergency Team (along with teams from the other shelters) to ensure we are prepared in case of an emergency. Advent/Christmas Mission

This year, we are extending an opportunity to be a blessing to several ministries in our local community. In the main entryway of the church, we have a space set aside to bring in gifts to benefit persons who receive help from three (3) local ministries: St. Paul UMC shoe bank, Mommy Shoppe, and Schlow Library.

You will find the outline of a tree above the credenza in the hallway. As you bring in gifts, we invite you to put the associated picture of your gift on the "tree" as a decoration. Here are the items we are inviting persons to purchase or make: Sneakers, Diapers, Hats, Mittens, Gloves, Scarves. These items will then be taken to each of these outreaches on Monday, December 22nd. Any items that come in after this date will be taken to these ministries and outreaches the first week of January.

Greeters and Ushers for December

Greeters are the first people to welcome folks to worship; they offer a smile, a greeting, and provide direction to the nursery, restrooms, offering plates, as well as answer other questions about our worship service. Ushers help people locate seats and advance the offering to the altar at the appropriate time. They also help with communion from time to time.
